# Learning Objectives.

Upon completion of this course, the students are expected to gain a better understanding of the diversity and complexity of PDEs that occurs in practical applications (e.g. Laplace, Heat, Stokes, Advection and Navier-Stokes equations), and basic concepts of numerical methods (e.g. finite difference, finite element) that can be used to approximate the solution of such PDEs. Student will also learn how to install and use the open-source finite element software FEniCSx (high-level Python interface) by implementing some of the numerical methods learn in class to approximate the solutions of classic PDEs.
